Curating Content





tessello enables certain users to be able to amend, add and curate additional content, if provided with 'curator' permission by an administrator. As a curator, you are able to:

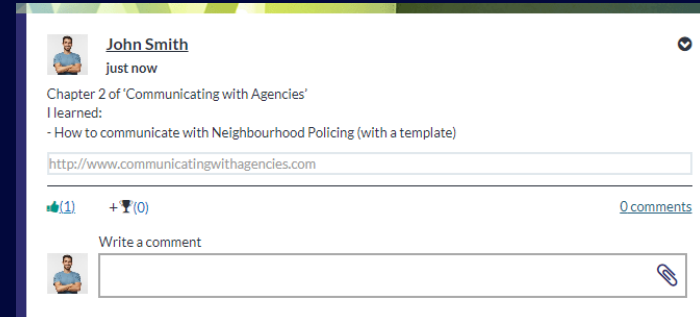
- Monitor learner contributions and promote content
- Curate your own materials and upload directly into existing tiles



Monitoring Contributions


Learners on tessello are adding their own experiences of informal learning into the system, and these experiences can be a mixture of events, documents, videos, weblinks etc.

Learners can vote for popular content, and you can see the number of votes each item of content has received.



Searching Contributions

If you are curating on a certain subject and wish to see what relevant information has been pulled in by other learners, you can do so by using the search functionality:




As with the above example about neighbourhood policing then, all relevant existing resources, as well as learner contributions are displayed.

Curating Contributions

As a curator, you are able to take a shared experience from a learner and promote it to one of the tiles in tessello, to draw everyone's attention to it. If you have Curator permissions a drop down arrow will appear on links and images. See below:


Once you click on curate link/image a dialog box will open, prepopulating the information from the shared attachment into resource format.

Curating Contributions

In the curation popup window for links or images you'll need to select a Category and a Programme to curate the resource into.

- Category: tile name (these are the small square tiles on your homepage in between Communities and My events)
- Programme: sub-section within a tile

Click the save icon and your new resource will be visible within your chosen tile.
